Announcing Winter Break Drivers' Education December 11 to January 3

National Safety Council, Greater Omaha Chapter announces dates of the Winter Break Drivers' Education program. Students from any school district can apply for this program which will be held at the Safety Council, 11620 M Circle, from December 11 to January 3, 2010. Students successfully passing both classroom and behind-the-wheel testing will receive a certificate of completion. Those under the age of 18 will also be issued a Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles waiver of testing.

Nebraska Office of Highway Safety confirms that students in Nebraska who complete an approved driver education program are less likely to be issued a citation or become involved in an accident.
