Forklift Operator Training

This four-hour training course meets OSHA's formal training requirements per 1910.178. Operators will receive training on a variety of topics, including: pre-start inspections; operating limitations; differences between trucks; steering and maneuvering; and vehicle capacity. Other workplace-related topics covered are: operating surfaces; narrow aisles; pedestrian traffic; hazardous locations; and ramps. Each participant who successfully passes the post-test will receive a certificate of completion and wallet card, indicating that they have met the formal training requirements to operate a powered industrial truck.
